## Daily Report

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## DAILY REPORT

### **July 12, 2011**

The group arrived at 10:00 AM and had a quick meeting in the CCC barn with Jim Brown, Alysa Austin and the group parents. The kids then said goodbye to their parents and got transported over to Gibson Hall at Becket to move into their temporary lodging. After quickly settling in to Gibson Hall, the group played some ice-breaker games (wah, kung fu) and then headed to lunch in the Becket dining hall. After lunch, the group returned to Gibson, had a short siesta, and then met at 1:30 outside for a name game and a few more ice-breakers. The group then discussed the group journal, leader of the day responsibilities, and group expectations and rules. After these discussions, the group did team-building activities until dinner. After a cook-out dinner, the group had health checks and then went back to Gibson to present their cultural topic presentations which had been assigned prior to their arrival. Each camper shared a presentation on a topic pertaining to Chinese culture. Shortly after the presentations the group had cabin chat and then went to bed.

### **July 13, 2011**

The group awoke at 7:30 and had breakfast at 8:15. After breakfast, the group changed into their bathing suits and took a swim test. Following the swim test, the group went back to Gibson and had a luggage relay race against ICEP New Zealand. The group then had time to re-pack their bags and move out of Gibson Hall. After lunch, the group met briefly with previous ICEP China participants and asked them questions pertaining to the trip. They then had a meeting with Jim Brown and Alysa Austin about non-negotiables, and took a group photo. After the photo, the group took a hike around the lake to Rocky Point, where they went over scenarios that could occur on the program, and had a talk about cultural expectations in China. Upon return from Rocky Point, the group beat ICEP New Zealand in a rousing kickball game. It was then time for dinner. Directly after dinner, the group boarded the bus at Moose field, and set off for the airport. The group arrived at JFK at around 10:30 PM and made it smoothly through security. The participants were given time to roam the terminal before meeting back at the gate at midnight for cabin chat. The group then boarded the plane and took off for Hong Kong/Shanghai.

### **July 14, 2011**

The group was aboard the Cathay Pacific flight to Hong Kong. As it was a long flight of about 15 hours, the participants slept for much of the way.

### **July 15, 2011**

The group arrived in Hong Kong at around 5:00 AM and had a 3 hour lay-over during which the campers filled out their CCRs. The group then boarded the plane for Shanghai. Upon arrival in Shanghai, the group was met by Shihai and the Shanghai YMCA staff and volunteers. They took a bus to the hotel, checked in, and then had a light lunch of noodles in a nearby noodle shop. The rest of the day was spent relaxing at the hotel in order to get over the jet-lag. The group went out to dinner at a very nice restaurant where they all sat around one big table. As most of the participants were falling asleep during dinner, upon return to the hotel, the group went straight to bed and did not have cabin chat.

**July 16, 2011**

After a late morning to help recover from the long travel day on the previous day, the group left the hotel at 9:30 and went to the bank to exchange money. After spending nearly the whole morning at the bank, the group then went to have some lunch at a restaurant in the train station. After, everyone got onto the bus and they went to the Yu Gardens. The group took a tour of the gardens, which were filled with coy ponds, natural rock sculptures, and Ancient Chinese styled buildings. After touring the gardens, the group boarded the bus again and traveled to Nanjing rd. At Nanjing rd., a shopping street that could remind some of Times Square in NYC, the group split up into groups and everyone spent time looking around the street and purchasing souvenirs. The group then went to sing karaoke and after that had a delicious hot pot dinner. After dinner, the group returned to the hotel, had chat, and went to bed.

**July 17, 2011**

After breakfast in the hotel, the group got on the bus and traveled to a local country town outside of Shanghai. As a group they toured the town, which could be compared to Venice because the town is filled with canals instead of roads, and saw the local markets and the post office and then went to a local restaurant for lunch. After touring the town a little more the group returned back to the hotel and after a rest went to a local shopping mall. The group explored the mall for a little over an hour and then had dinner in the mall. After dinner they went to the Yangtze River bank to view Old Shanghai at night. After taking time exploring the bank and looking at the beautiful view, the group returned back to the hotel for the night, had chat, and the group went to bed.

**July 18, 2011**

The group ate breakfast at the hotel and then left for the Dapu community center to meet the Chinese teens whom they would be working with during their time in Shanghai. At the community center, the group played some icebreakers with the Chinese teens so they could meet each other. After they had time to get to know each other the group and the Chinese teens split into 3 different groups (Group A,B,C) to go over their first service day together and what they were going to do with each other. After each group finished planning, everyone went to meet with the general secretary of the Shanghai YMCA for a welcoming speech and tour of the YMCA. After the tour, the group returned to their large meeting room with the Chinese teens and the Chinese teens taught them a Chinese song called the two tigers. Everyone then got on the bus and traveled to a senior home to share performances with them,

**July 19, 2011**

The leader of the day woke the group up at 7:20. The group ate breakfast at the hotel buffet as usual, and then proceeded to the Dapu Community Center. There, they split into their three groups; one group of 6 Americans and 6 Chinese volunteers, one group of 5 Americans and 4 Chinese volunteers, and one group of 4 Americans and 4 Chinese volunteers. Each group planned activities and English teaching for students aged 6-12. The groups spent an hour in the morning conducting classes with the day camp kids, and then had lunch. After lunch, they had some free time to relax. Group C then had a calligraphy lesson, while groups A and B had time to walk around the city of Shanghai. The groups taught afternoon lessons at their respective day

camps and then came back to the hotel, had dinner, and went back to the hotel to celebrate a camper's birthday. Shihai bought a cake and the group had a small party. The group then had chat and went to bed.

### **July 20, 2011**

The group had breakfast as usual then met with the Chinese counterparts at 8:30 at the Dapu Community Center. They divided into groups again, and each group did service at their respective day camps; teaching English and playing games with the day camp participants. Group C spent the morning taking the day camp kids to the park to hand out flyers on recycling and the environment. The groups had lunch, taught afternoon classes, and went back to the hotel around 5:30. After dinner, the group went to Janjing Street to go shopping in small groups of 4, for an hour. The group then returned to the hotel, had chat, and went to bed.

### **July 21, 2011**

After breakfast, the group met up at the community center. For "Chinese-American Friendship Day" the Chinese teens took the American teens around Shanghai in their groups. One group went ice-skating while another group went to a market to go shopping. Each group had lunch separately and then the whole group got together for some karaoke. After karaoke, the group took the subway back to the center for a farewell party at which each group made speeches and did performances for the other groups. The participants then got into 5 groups instead of 3 and each group went to dinner at a Chinese counterpart's house. Everyone was back to the hotel by 9:00 at which point the group met for chat and went to bed.

### **July 22, 2011**

After an early wakeup to go to a local park to practice tai chi with some locals, the group packed up their belongings and boarded the bus to head to Hangzhou. After the bus ride, which included a rest stop, the group arrived in Hangzhou and checked into their hotel. After checking in, the group went to a local restaurant to have dinner with the general secretary of the Hangzhou YMCA. After dinner, the group returned back to the hotel, had chat, and went to bed.

### **June 23, 2011**

After breakfast, which was in a restaurant across the street from their hotel, the group went to the Hangzhou YMCA to meet the new group of Chinese students that they would be working with and to receive a presentation about the Hangzhou YMCA. After the presentation, the group played some icebreakers with the Chinese students and conversed with them to get to know them better. Once they were done with icebreakers, the group received a professional tai chi lesson. After the lesson, the group played ping pong and spent some time with the Chinese students. The group then had lunch in a restaurant behind the YMCA and then traveled to the Lingyin Temple, an old Buddhist temple, where they received a tour led by a Buddhist monk. After the tour, the group had time to explore the mountain and stream within the temple. Then, the group went to dinner at a local restaurant. After dinner, the group returned to the hotel because of hard rain. After spending some time hanging out at the hotel, the group had chat and went to bed.

### **July 24, 2011**

The group had breakfast in the morning and then headed to the Hangzhou Citizens' Center. Upon arrival the group was given a tour of the facility. The group visited the Hangzhou

Development Center for a tour and video of what the future plans are for the city of Hangzhou. After, the group had lunch in the complex, followed by free time to explore the complex and its facilities. Next the group went to Dodu City, a two story mock city within the complex, to do their service work for the day. Each member of the group was assigned to a different job to help teach Chinese children how to do that job. After the service work, the group went to dinner and then visited the Qiantang River Balcony to see a view of the city at night. Then, the group returned to the hotel for the night, had chat, and went to bed.

### **July 25, 2011**

The group got up a bit later than average, at 8:00, and ate breakfast at a restaurant across the street from the hotel, using their personal, pre-loaded with money, breakfast cards. After breakfast, everyone boarded the bus and headed for the West Lake. The group arrived at the West Lake and took a boat to the biggest island in the middle of the lake. The group sat outside on the boat, on the back deck, where it was very hot, but they got a good view of the lake and surrounding mountains. Once the group arrived at the island, they went to the most famous area, the “Three Moon Reflection” and toured the island and the Bai Causeway in small groups. They then got back onto the boat and went to the mainland, where they had a nice lunch in the most famous restaurant in Hangzhou, overlooking the West Lake. The group arrived at the restaurant about 45 minutes early for lunch, so they were given time to walk around the West Lake area. Many participants decided to stay in the air-conditioned restaurant rather than walk around. The group was also joined by Adam, one of the volunteers from Shanghai who decided to visit with the group again. After lunch, the group went back to the YMCA to plan for the next day’s service, with the Chinese volunteer counterparts. They planned for about an hour in 3 groups, and then had free time at the YMCA until dinner. Some participants decided to go back to the hotel before dinner. The group then had dinner at the YMCA and then went to Hefang Street, a street market. The group left Hefang St. at 8:40 and went back to the hotel to have chat and go to bed.

### **July 26, 2011**

The group woke up at 7:00, had breakfast across the street from the hotel, and got on the bus to go to the Hangzhou Youth and Children’s Development Center at 8:00. Upon arrival at the center, the group was introduced to the children they would be working with, and then they split up into three groups, each group receiving a group of children. These children were rural children whose parents work in the city for the summer, so the children are left alone during the day with nowhere to go, so they come to the center for this special day camp program. The children did not speak any English, so the language barrier was apparent. The kids were very rambunctious and a challenge for the ICEP participants to control. The morning was spent with each group teaching their group of kids English songs, games, and words, for about 2.5 hours. The group then had lunch with the children, followed by some free time to roam around while the children took naps. At around 2:00 pm, the group got back together and took a Peking Opera class and a paper-cutting class alongside the children. After the classes, the participants said good-bye to the children, took a group photo, and rushed back onto the bus so that they could get back to the hotel and to a bank before it closed at 5:00. Many participants were running low on cash. The group was successful in getting to the bank and obtaining money. At 5:30, they re-boarded the bus for dinner, which was back in the direction of the Youth and Children’s Development Center. After dinner, the group went to a night market by the hotel. After the

night market, the group returned to the hotel at 9:00 and had a debrief of the day and the service projects. The group discussed what went well and what could be done better in the future. The debrief lasted about an hour and many good, constructive comments were made. The leaders then discussed the group journal, not being too loud in the hotel, and the consequence for the group for failing to stay in groups of 4 at the night market. It was decided that the next time the group had free-time, they would have to stay together as one big group. After these conversations the group had a quick chat and went to bed.

### **July 27, 2011**

The group awoke at 7:30 and was on the bus heading for the senior citizen center by 8:30. The group was given a warm welcome and greeting by the senior citizens, who performed some Chinese opera, played traditional instruments, and sang songs for the group. The ICEP participants then performed for the old people; they sang “Two Tigers”, “My Highland Goat”, “Sons of Noble Living”, and “CHICKEN”. After the performances the group took a walk to the Hangzhou Party museum and took a tour of the museum. They then walked back to the senior center for a lunch of soup dumplings. After lunch, the group split into two groups and went to visit two different old men at their houses to chat with them and keep them company. They then returned to the center for a calligraphy lesson and contest. Afterwards, they went back to the YMCA to plan for the next day’s farewell party. Following this, the group had dinner and then had some free time to explore the area around the hotel, for which they stayed together as one group. After their free time, the group met for chat at 9:00.

### **July 28, 2011**

The group started off the day with breakfast, followed by a bus trip to the Six Harmonies Pagoda. At the pagoda, the group learned about the creation and construction of the pagoda, and then they climbed up to the top. At the top, the group was able to see much of the surrounding mountains and the river. After leaving the pagoda, the group returned back to their hotel for a little rest, and then went to the Hangzhou YMCA. At the Hangzhou YMCA the group and their Chinese partners had their farewell party. Everyone took turns presenting, playing games, and singing songs. After, the group said their goodbyes to their partners and then went to the Hangzhou night market before returning to their hotel for the night. Once back at the hotel, the group had chat and went to bed.

### **July 29, 2011**

After breakfast, the group packed their luggage up for their travel day to Nanjing. After a 4 hour bus ride, the group arrived in Nanjing and met with their service partner Richard. Then, the group checked into their hotel and had some time to relax before dinner. After dinner at a local restaurant, the group returned back to the hotel to relax, prepare for their homestays the next day, and had chat and went to bed.

### **July 30, 2011**

After a morning of rest, the group met in the lobby at 11:30, checked out of the hotel, packed their luggage onto the bus, and went to lunch. After lunch the group boarded the bus and went to the No. 4 Middle School in Nanjing to meet their homestay partners and homestay families. After the group introduced themselves to their new Chinese partners and each homestay pairing

had a chance to chat together, the group as a whole played icebreakers together. After many rounds of icebreakers and other fun games the ICEP group had a quick meeting about the homestays, said their goodbyes for the day, and went home with their homestay families for the rest of the night.

### **July 31, 2011**

This was the morning after the group's first night with their homestay families. The group assembled at 9:00 AM outside the gate of the memorial museum for the victims of the Nanjing Massacre. The group briefly shared stories from their first night with their homestays before getting a tour of the memorial and the museum. The tour ended at around 11:00, at which time the participants along with their homestay partners were given about a half hour of free time to roam the museum and memorial. The group then boarded the bus and headed to lunch at a restaurant in the area. After lunch, the group headed to the Research Institution of the Chinese cloud brocade. This was an institution dedicated to studying the ancient silk clothing and process of making the silk. After a tour of the museum, the participants were given some free time to explore in the museum while the leaders conducted mid-session conferences with one participant at a time. At around 4:30, the participants split off and went with their respective homestay families to the Confucian Temple Square and to dinner, after which they each headed home.

### **August 1, 2011**

The group met up at 10:00 AM at the Zhongshan Hotel near the Zhujiang Lu junction for a discussion of the previous day's activities. They split off into three smaller groups, each participant staying with their homestay partner, in order to have more effective discussions about peace and the Nanjing Massacre. Following these discussions, each group planned out performances for the post-lunch presentation to the senior citizens. After lunch, the group exchanged presentations with the community residents and senior citizens. Following these presentations, each participant went home with their homestay partner.

### **August 2, 2011**

The group met at 9:00 AM on the Purple Mountain. They took a small tram to the base of the Dr. Sun Yat-sen Mausoleum where they were given an explanation of who Dr. Sun Yat-sen was, and the importance of the site. They were then given time to climb the many steps leading up to the mausoleum itself. After seeing the mausoleum, the group headed to another part of the mountain to the Lingu Temple. Inside the Lingu Temple compound, the group had a vegetarian noodle soup lunch. They then received an explanation of the Lingu Temple and were subsequently given time to climb to the top of the main pagoda. The group met back up at the bottom of the pagoda, at which point one participant realized that she had left her camera at the top of the pagoda. One leader went back up to look for it with the camper, while the rest of the group waited at the bottom. After the Lingu Temple, the group continued on to the Ming Tomb, the largest tomb in China. At the end of the visit, the ICEP participants had a quick meeting with their leaders to check-in and discuss the plans for the rest of the week, while the Chinese homestay partners had a meeting with their leader. Following these meetings, each ICEP participant went home with their homestay partner.

### **August 3, 2011**

The group met up at 10:00 AM and walked together to the YMCA center for mentally challenged adults. The first activity that the group did with the adults in the center was making paper roses. The mentally challenged adults taught the ICEP group and their homestay partners how to make the roses. After this, the group played a few games with the adults and then both the ICEP group with their homestay partners and the mentally challenged adults shared their own performances and songs with everyone. After a lunch of soup dumplings, the group and their homestay partners visited the Cultural Museum of Nanjing, the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest cultural museum in China. At the museum, the group learned about many ancient Chinese artifacts for example ancient jade and silk artifacts. After the group explored the whole museum, the ICEP participants went home with their homestay partners for the night.

### **August 4, 2011**

After a morning of rest and time with their homestay families, the group met up in the afternoon at the YMCA community center. At the center the group was given a lesson on Chinese flower paintings. After watching the instructor paint flowers, the group all received their own paint supplies and tried to create their own flowers. After the lesson, the group got ready for the farewell party that afternoon. The group and their homestay partners all sang songs, shared memories from the week, and thanked each other for the great time they had together. Also, the group watched a slideshow of the week they had had to reflect on the good times had by all.

### **August 5, 2011**

The group had the whole morning and early afternoon with their homestay families so they could spend a final day with them. At 3:00 the group boarded a bus and headed towards the Nanjing airport. After an hour long bus ride the group arrived at the airport, and got ready for the plane ride from Nanjing to Beijing. The group arrived in Beijing at night and checked into their hotel. After, they had dinner, returned back to the hotel, had their first cabin chat in a week, and went to bed.

### **August 6, 2011**

The group had the morning off to rest. They met at 11:30 to walk to lunch, which was at a restaurant near the YMCA hotel. After lunch, the group returned to the YMCA hotel, which also functions as the YMCA office and community center. They met with the new group of volunteers who they would be working with in Beijing to do some ice breakers and split into groups to plan for the service project for the next day. As soon as this was finished, the group had about an hour of free time before dinner. After dinner the group went to a shopping area near the hotel for about an hour and then came back to the hotel for chat.

### **August 7, 2011**

The group awoke at 7:30 to have breakfast in the hotel before boarding the bus at 8:30. They arrived at the church where they were to do service for the day at around 9:30 and had a tour of the church before beginning their service. The participants then split off into three groups to work with groups of children in differing age brackets. One group worked with children ages 5-8, another group worked with children ages 9-10, and the last group worked with those 11-13. Each group did the usual teaching English and playing games with their children until lunch, which was provided by the church community. After eating in the church, the group headed to

798 Art Street, a street full of artisans demonstrating and selling their artwork. The group had about 3 hours to explore this area before dinner. After dinner the group had chat before going to bed.

### **August 8, 2011**

By 8:30, the group was on their way to the Great Wall of China! The bus ride to get there was about an hour and a half. Upon arrival at the Great Wall, the participants and Chinese counterparts took a photo at the base of the wall before the group split up to start climbing. The group did not stay together the whole time on the wall, but split up into smaller groups to climb, as the first few sections were very crowded. A meeting point at one of the watchtowers was set before everyone headed off to climb the wall. Once the group re-assembled at the meeting point, which was about 2 km up from the base, they took a group photo, enjoyed the view and the site, and then walked down together. On the way down, some participants stopped briefly to purchase souvenirs from the Great Wall. After the Great Wall, the group boarded the bus and headed for lunch. Following lunch, the group continued on to the Beijing Olympic Park and Water Cube. They were given about 2 hours to explore the area and the water cube, after which they headed to dinner. As the group was tired from the long day, they went back to the hotel directly after dinner, watched a video made for them by the Shanghai volunteers who were visiting, and had a debrief of the last few days before cabin chat.

### **August 9, 2011**

After breakfast at the hotel, the group traveled to a rural village outside of Beijing. The group went to an American run orphanage in the village to do some community service. After a tour around the facility, the group helped clean around the orphanage and spent time playing with the children. After all the cleaning was done the group went outside to play with more children in the playground that the orphanage had for the children that lived there. The group ate lunch at the orphanage. After lunch, an American named Ben, whose family lived and helped out at the orphanage, gave us a tour around the local village. After the tour the group got on the bus and traveled to a senior home to meet up with the Beijing teens and do more community service. At the senior center the group did many different performances for the elders to brighten up their day. As the group gathered to leave a downpour of rain started and they waited for it to slow down before they left to get on the bus. After, the group went to a hot pot dinner and some of the Chinese partners from Shanghai came to visit and to celebrate one of the group members' birthdays with everyone (even though it was a day early). After a small celebration the group returned to the hotel for chat and bed.

### **August 10, 2011**

The group spent the whole day at the Summer Palace, the summer getaway for the Chinese emperors. The palace was more like a large park with a bunch of ancient buildings, sculptures, artifacts, and beautiful scenery. The group split into three different groups with the Chinese teens and explored the palace all day. After their exploration, the group returned back to the hotel to rest and then went to dinner. After dinner, the group went to the local mall for a surprise. The surprise was watching the Harry Potter movie! Everyone had a great time. After the movie, the group returned to the hotel for another birthday celebration (because it was then his actual birthday) and after had chat and went to bed.

### **August 11, 2011**

The group started the day by traveling to one of the Beijing YMCA Community Centers. At the center, the group had a two-hour lesson in gong fu. After the lesson and a little bit of practice, the group changed into their swimsuits and went for a swim in the community center's pool. After their swim the group met with the Beijing teens, ate lunch, and planned out their service day, which was teaching and playing with kids at the community center. After they were done planning, the group went to meet with the children, split into three groups, and started their activities. After the service with the children, the group went to a buffet dinner in Beijing. After dinner, the group returned to the hotel for a free night to enjoy each other's company. After some time together, the group gathered for chat and went to bed.

### **August 12, 2011**

The group awoke at 7:30, went to get breakfast from a small grocery store down the street from the hotel, and met in the lobby with the Chinese counterparts at 8:30. They walked to the subway station all together, to go to Tiananmen Square and the Forbidden City. They spent about 20 minutes in Tiananmen Square looking around, and then took an underground walkway to the Forbidden City. At the Forbidden City, the group split up into three different groups, and each group was given an audio tour in English, so that they could take self-guided tours around the Forbidden City. They were given about 2 hours to do this. The group then reassembled at the back gate of the Forbidden City and walked to meet the bus. The bus took everyone to Hutong Street, where they were taken in rickshaws to the homes of local families to have lunch. After lunch, the group met back up for a tour of Hutong Street, which included a trip up the old drum tower to see the drum show, which doubled as a method of keeping time in the old days. After descending the tower, the group took the bus back to the hotel, where they had a couple hours to rest before the farewell party. They went upstairs to the 10th floor of the hotel for the farewell party with the Chinese Counterparts at around 6:00. At the farewell party, they ate lots of food, exchanged performances, gifts, and goodbyes. The group also presented gifts to Zhu Qi and Shihai as gestures of gratitude for all their hard work planning and facilitating the program. After the farewell party, the group met for chat.

### **August 13, 2011**

As this was the free day, the group decided to get started at 9:00 AM. Though some members of the group were ready to leave at 9:00, others were not, so they did not end up leaving the hotel until 10:00. They decided to take the subway to the Beijing zoo, where they spent the morning looking at some animals, and generally relaxing in the zoo as a group. They had lunch in the zoo complex, and then headed back to the subway station to get to a very large market, where they spent about 3 hours searching for last minute souvenirs and hanging out. After the market, the group decided to go out to dinner at a restaurant where they could all fit around one big table, as it was their last meal in China. They had a nice dinner, and then went back to the hotel. The group met upstairs on the 10th floor for their last night. They filled out the last section of their CCRs, and then had a very long cabin chat. As it was their last night in China, the group was permitted to hang out in the upstairs common room until they wanted to go to bed.

### **August 14, 2011**

The group awoke at 6:00 AM and was downstairs by 6:30 AM. They loaded their luggage onto the bus, and set off for the airport. They were given breakfast sandwiches on the bus before

arriving at the airport. The group checked in, and only had minor issues with over-weight bags that they were able to work out at the counter. They made it through security with plenty of time to relax before the 10:00 flight to Hong Kong. They arrived in Hong Kong at around 1:00, and had about 3 hours before their next flight to JFK. During the lay-over, the participants were given about \$10 each to buy lunch in the airport. They then boarded the final plane, and enjoyed a 15 hour flight back to the United States. They arrived at JFK around 8:00; however the plane took a while to get cleared for a gate, so they did not disembark until around 8:45. They made it through customs and security without a problem, collected their baggage, and headed to the bus which was waiting for them at the terminal. They then drove about 3 hours back to camp and got there around 2:00 AM. Upon arrival, the boys headed to the lower Wellspring, and the girls headed to the lower Four Seasons, where they would be sleeping.
